Instances/ Practices amounting to Ragging:

- ▶ Abetment of ragging
- ▶ Criminal conspiracy to rag
- ▶ Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging
- ▶ Public nuisance created during ragging
- ▶ Violation of decency and morals through ragging
- ▶ Injury to body amounting to grievous hurt
- ▶ Wrongful restraint and confinement
- ▶ Assaults, extortions, trespass and criminal intimidation including sexual offences
- ▶ Psychological humiliation
