The session was judged by two esteemed faculty members:

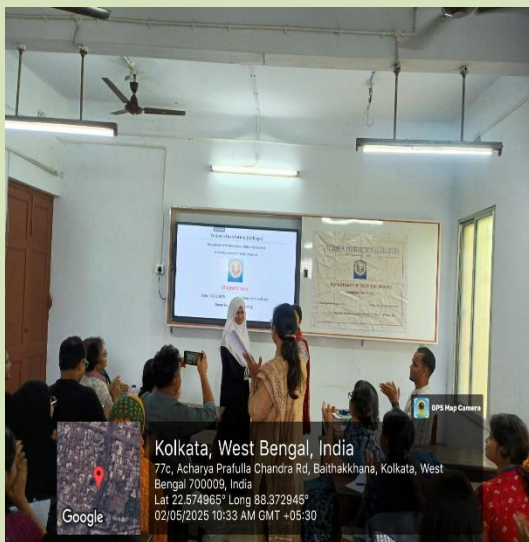
- **Dr. Paramita Roy Biswas, Department of Economics.**
